Our students continue to show tremendous resilience despite ongoing disruption to their lives. At this time of the year, a typical morning involves walking to school in a torrential downpour, with no pavements, negotiating puddles of mud and sewage, sometimes up to their knees. In addition to environmental hazards, movements are also limited by the activity of gangs restricting access to alleyways.

The other day I went out to chat to students at playtime. As I got closer to one group, I was shocked about the discussion I heard. While climbing up and down the ladders and ropes, they were casually sharing about who they knew in the community who had been injured or killed by gunfire.

Of course it is terrifying to hear such young children talking this way. It makes me realize just how important it is that these 7, 8 & 9 year old's have somewhere they feel safe.

How thankful we can be that the evil and unrest so many children in the world are experiencing right now, does not have to dictate their future or be their master. Romans 6:11 reminds us that we are alive to God in Jesus Christ. It is by grace that we are able to offer safety, hope and salvation to these children.

We're so excited to introduce you to Adner, our new year 7 teacher. Adner graduated from college in 2019 and has two years experience teaching children with autism in Rio Grande do Norte, the state adjacent to Ceará. In 2021 Adner got married and moved to Fortaleza.

Adner is a talented teacher with a big heart. She is a great fit in our team of staff and also loves to sing. When we asked her to tell us a bit more of her story we were moved to tears.

Adner was born prematurely and was the second child of her mother, whose first pregnancy ended in a miscarriage. When she was just 9 months old she pulled an oven over on top of herself and nearly died. When she was 5, she had another accident which temporarily paralyzed her legs. She remembers praying one night that she would be able to walk again and the next day, she got the feeling back in her legs.

When Adner went to college, she had a strong desire that her profession and her faith in God would overlap heavily in her workplace. When we offered her the position as year 7 teacher, Adner accepted straight away because she understood that The University of Life was the place where this would be fulfilled.


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Jerónimo is 8 years old and in the 4th year at The university of Life. He lives with his parents and is an only child
